ANNUAL GERERAL MEETING

October 26th, 2012

- 1. <u>Call to Order</u>: The meeting was called to order at 6:17 pm by Cyrus Sy, President of the Board.
- 2. <u>Adoption of Minutes</u> from 2011 Annual General Meeting held on Nov 9th, 2010: <u>MOTION</u>: Kamy Zargarpour moved to adopt the minutes of last year's AGM; seconded by Pam Warner and passed unanimously.
- 3. President's Report: The key points of the report were reviewed including:
 - Introduction of GRG Grand Parents Raising Grandchildren support line greatly increased our visibility and marked the culmination of a long effort despite difficult financial times..
 - Year ahead will focus on building our programs, strengthening our partnerships and executing our strategic plans.
 - The excellent work of the Executive Director over the last year in both day to day operations and in cultivating relationships in the community. A thank you to all staff for their many contributions throughout the year
 - There were a number of changes to the Board over the year notably the loss of long term board member Glenn Schmidt and Malcolm Read. We were fortunate to add Poh Tan and Kostya Polyakov who bring their experience and enthusiasm to the board.
 - Strategic plan key priorities for the next 3-5 years are:
 - Develop a predictable, diversified funding stream.
 - Become a leading resource for GRG in BC.
 - Formalize a peer based parenting model.
 - Create a dedicated advocacy program.
- 4. Treasurer's Report and Approval of Financial Statements: Treasurer Rob Kaufman reported that

finances including the funding reserves for the PSS place us in a good position for the next couple of years and are stable and well managed.

Total revenues were \$525,693 as compared to \$552,226 in 2011 leaving us with an excess of \$4,467 versus \$38,532 of 2011. The primary funding sources for PSS remain the MCFD, United Way and Gaming grants.

The society received a clean audit report from our auditor at Wolrige Mahon – Chartered Accountants for the PSS's Financial Statements for the 2011-2012 fiscal year.

MOTION: Rob Kaufman moved to approve the Financial Statements for the 2011-2012 fiscal year. This was seconded by Kamy Zargarpour and passed unanimously.

5. Appointment of Auditor: Rob Kaufman recommended we continue to use Wolrige Mahon as they have experience with Not for Profits organizations.

MOTION: Rob Kaufman moved to appoint Wolrige Mahon as auditors for the 2012/2013 fiscal year. This was seconded by Kamy Zargarpour and passed unanimously.

- 6. Executive Director's Report:
 - Executive Director Carol Ross reported it was a huge year for PSS with the GRG go live and having Victoria approach us with new funding. Great PR that will form the basis for future growth.
 - Hosted 5 GRG picnics across the province, launched our new web and 3 provincial newsletters with 22 grandparent newsletters together with new Facebook and blog entries.
 - Held 7 volunteer facilitator training sessions, 33 support circles in 5 languages facilitated by 65 volunteers.
 - Over 11,000 volunteer hours were recorded.
 - We ran out of our GRG legal guides and worked to get funding for a reprint.
 - Developed new workshops on effective, ethical discipline.
 - Recognition of our key funders MCFD Ministry for Children and Family Development. BC Gaming Policy Branch and United Ways of Fraser Valley, Lower Mainland and Northern BC that allow us to provide our programs to families across B.C.
 - Moved our Victoria office together with clean up and organization of all files.
- 7. Program Reports

Lower Mainland/Coastal/Fraser Valley and Interior Regions: Bella Cenzero

- 3 new circles and partnerships were started.
- Conducted 3 workshops and 4 training sessions.
- Appreciate the many community agencies and partners that help us with our mission.
- Saw increased funding and volunteer numbers and practicum students placed in the program.

Central Vancouver Island: Sandi Halvorson

- GRG groups in all four communities continue to grow.
- 6 volunteer facilitators were trained.
- Held the 6th annual GRG picnic in Port Alberni and the 2nd one for Duncan.
- Next year plans include: volunteer retention, program promotion and GRG family events.

Victoria: Trisha Chestnutt and Annie Lavack

- Moved to new offices during this past year together with culling and organizing of files.
- Facilitator training for 6 participants.
- 2 overnight trips for GRG together with the picnic.
- 2 presentations on GRG to UVic students.
- Implemented a four part program with the City of Victoria.
- United Way Victoria funded a series of self advocacy training workshops for GRG.

Prince George: Jessica Turner

- Continue to produce the "Village" a newsletter that provides lists of all resources in the north that relate to parenting.

The past year has been another year marked by steady growth and change at PSS. While our mission continues to be to serve and support all those in a parenting role, the Grandparents Raising Grandchildren (GRG) Support Line and related projects and resources, continue to be one of our most prominent and important programs, especially when you look at the increasing case-load and impact on those it serves. The Support line has become a de-facto resource in the province for kinship caregivers looking for support, resource materials and advocacy services.

We will continue to strengthen programs like the GRG line, which are core to our strategic goals over the next few years. We also know that external communication and engagement with the community will be key to ensuring our programs have maximum reach throughout the communities across BC we serve. Efforts to improve our social media presence including the blog and Facebook are starting to show results.

People

With growth comes change, and there have been new faces with amazing skill and talents joining the PSS team. From co-op students to new executive assistance and communications staff, the new faces have injected a renewed sense of optimism and energy into the organization. The new additions to the team have also brought along with them a willingness to try new ideas to help the organization better engage with the community at large.

It goes without saying that our staff, volunteers and partners continue to be the foundation of PSS, and I have nothing but gratitude and appreciation for each and every one of you. And of course, special thanks go to our tireless Executive Director, Carol Ross who never ceases to amaze us all with her seemingly boundless capacity to juggle so many responsibilities.

The Board

Our board also welcomed several new faces over the past year, including Louise Costello, Catherine Schiller and Cheryl Dawson. All three have brought tremendous energy, insight and perspective to our board team.

In order to maintain a high-level of board engagement we do much work through subcommittees such as Marketing and Promotions, Finance, Fundraising and PSS Peer Support Model. Each committee is led by a board member, and some committees, such as fundraising, include staff and other volunteers.

The sub-committees allow us to maintain a steady focus on our strategic 3-5 year goals, and allow us to adapt to changing circumstances and pursue new initiatives. I am especially

encouraged by the fact that our fundraising committee has gotten off the ground, and a small working group has also been started to focus on formalization and promotion of PSS's unique peer-based support model.

It was unfortunate that one of our newest board members, Cheryl Dawson recently stepped down to pursue an exciting career opportunity. However, in her short time on the board, Cheryl did an exceptional job as chair of the Fundraising Committee. We also had to say goodbye to one of our longtime board members, Pam Warner. Pam has been a steady contributor to the board and provided much support and advice especially in the areas of HR and legal issues. I thank both Pam and Cheryl immensely for their contributions and wish them both all the best.

Strategic Plan Update

We continue to stay the course on our 3-5 year strategic plan. The key strategic goals remain unchanged.

- 1. Develop a predictable, diversified funding stream.
- 2. Become a leading resource for GRG/kinship care providers in BC.
- 3. Formalize a peer-based parenting model.
- 4. Create a dedicated advocacy program.

As always, we continue to review and adjust priorities as necessary on an annual basis. During the 2013-2014 year, the board will be focused on increasing unrestricted funding, improving our fiscal reporting mechanisms, completing a marketing campaign focused on promoting the peerbased support model, pursuing greater collaboration with other non-profits like PSS, and finally, focusing on long-term planning for the organization including succession planning.

In Closing

As the year comes to a close, there is much to be excited about in 2014. 2014 will prove to be hallmark year for PSS as it will be our 40th year anniversary! The entire PSS membership including staff, board and volunteers have much to be proud about. Our 40th anniversary hopefully will be a reminder of how far we have progressed as an organization and what has been accomplished. It will be a year of celebration and reflection as we mark four decades of upholding a mission to protect the safety and well being of children.

I hope you will be as excited as I am about the upcoming year, and encourage all members to participate in our anniversary celebrations!

OVERVIEW OF THE YEAR

This fiscal year was a time of growth, change and innovation. As always we relied heavily on the skills, kindness and support of our many volunteers. Their commitment benefited families and service providers in unique and valuable ways all across the province. It is impossible to capture the full impact on families of all the large and small details of the work done by everyone involved with our Society. We may be small; together we definitely are mighty.

There are numbers, of course, and definitely success stories to share and observe, but capturing the whole amazing picture is impossible. Sometimes we don't learn outcomes for months or years and then may receive a thank you note or an update call, or even see a policy change. Sometimes we can only trust in the seeds that have been planted without ever knowing how or if they will grow. It is a privilege for me to be immersed in all that is "PSS" and to be walking side by side with the skilled, dedicated paid and unpaid workers, community partners, funders and supporters who make it all possible.

We worked hard this past year to increase our visibility and outreach; to respond to the identified needs of parents and grandparents; and to play a collaborative role with colleagues working for the safety, rights and wellbeing of children and all family members across BC. We also experimented with social media tools, video applications, and new workshops for use in community. We had success in securing additional funding that allowed us to expand our work for and with kinship care providers – Grandparents Raising Grandchildren. We also found new partners and allies and deepened key relationships with staff within MCFD and the Office of the Representative for Children and Youth.

It was a very good year.

PROGRAM and ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

You will see from the staff reports that each region differs significantly and this depends greatly on location, staff hours, population, travel time and distance, community resources and level of volunteerism.

Here are a few highlights from the provincial office:

• Much higher media visibility including CBC radio; opinion piece printed in Vancouver Sun for Family Day; press releases in community papers; interviews by journalists; and article in the Vancouver Foundation's publication

• Ongoing development and improvement of data collection tools; website; and Facebook

- Expanded office space in Burnaby
- Began process of updating Grandparents Raising Grandchildren: A Legal Guide

• Whole Brain Child Workshop series thanks to presenter Max Innes and the launch of our own workshops on effective discipline

• Consultations with MCFD policy staff regarding the Extended Family Program

• Hosted GRG family picnics in 5 regions and continued our wonderful partnership with the Galiano Conservancy Association, for family "respite" trips to the Island

• Held 7 Initial Volunteer Facilitator Training sessions (Vancouver, Victoria and Prince George) and trained a total of 53 participants.

• Produced and distributed 3 provincial newsletters; 22 Grandparent newsletters on Vancouver Island and monthly editions of The Village (Parenting Resource and Service Directory) for the Prince George region.

• Initiated and assessed a new Communications/Executive Assistant position

• High involvement in interagency planning and collaboration.

• Much appreciated increase in Gaming funds will continue to help support the growing GRG work as well as the high workload in the Lower Mainland

• Two Federal Grants: Summer Student Program and New Horizons commitment for our GRG film project

• MCFD funds to assist with update of the GRG Legal Guide

• Law Foundation of BC project funds to create and deliver GRG Legal Seminars

• Project funding from the Vancouver Foundation to initiate a GRG Coordination position for the Lower Mainland

RECOGNITION AND APPRECIATION

I would like to recognize the continued support of the Ministry for Children and Family Development (MCFD), the BC Gaming Policy Branch and the United Ways of the Lower Mainland, and Northern BC for funding our core programs. We stretch every penny to be able to train and support our volunteer facilitators, deliver our accessible Parent and Grandparent Support Circle Program and provide parenting education and resources for families across BC. That funding, along with additional project funds, and the kind donations of our supporters, allows us to continue to deliver strong, inclusive, accessible programs and services for anyone and everyone in a parenting role in BC.

When I tell colleagues or the media that our core staff numbers last year were equivalent to 7.5 full time positions for the entire province, they look at me in disbelief. We are so very fortunate to be able to attract highly skilled, experienced workers who are dedicated to the goals and values of PSS. They definitely are not here because of the wages; rather they are here because of the hopefulness of the work and the opportunity to have a positive impact on the lives of children and families and on social change. Again, it is impossible to find adequate words to express my respect and appreciation for each and every staff member of PSS.

Much recognition and appreciation also goes to our many volunteers and for the thousands of hours they again contributed this fiscal year. They facilitate our circles; provide governance, legal advice, staff development, and professional consultation; they share their wisdom, design skills and resources; they create data management tools and carry our research; they provide child care and their parenting expertise. Our many community partners host our circles, often offering free meeting space, child care and snacks as well as extensive promotion of our services. Our volunteers provide the strong foundation on which to stand to deliver all of our services.

CONCLUSION

Last year I talked about the ongoing impact on children and families who struggle every day to survive living at or below the poverty line. We see or hear from these families every day. Last year was the United Nation's Year for the Eradication of Poverty. As a world and nation, we have yet to reach that goal and that means the effort must rise, and the awareness grow until all can see that change is both possible and imperative. The responsibility for ending poverty and all forms of inequality lies with each of us.

We know that parents do their best when they have enough of all the essentials – food; shelter; health care; a living wage; accessible, inclusive resources; access to justice and education; and fundamental respect and understanding for the realities and inequities they may be facing. At Parent Support Services we are committed to continuing our work in supporting children and families across BC until that work is no longer necessary.

2014 will be our 40th anniversary. Together we can and must make a difference. One of our current key priorities is to see improved supports for kinship care providers. That change would be an excellent anniversary present. If it could be coupled with a province wide commitment to an affordable child care plan and a significant shift from the harsh realities facing too many Aboriginal families, it would be the most excellent gift ever. Please join us in 2014 to build on the successes of the past and to do what is right for the future of all children in the province.

Parent Support Services Society of BC Annual Program Reports for the fiscal year 2012-2013

Central Vancouver Island Submitted by: Sandi Halvorson, Program Coordinator

Over the past several years the main focus of my work seems to be the support of grandparents who are raising their grandchildren. Those groups in 4 central island communities (Port Alberni, Parksville, Nanaimo and Duncan) continued to grow.

In April 2012 volunteers from the Central Island met in Parksville for a day of learning, sharing and appreciation.

During the summer of 2012 the 7th annual GRG picnic was held at Sproat Lake Provincial Park in Port Alberni, as was the first annual GRG picnic at Transfer Beach in Ladysmith. We enjoyed two trips to Galiano Island, an overnight Nature camp for GRG families in July and a day trip for GRG families in August. The feedback about the trips continues to be overwhelmingly positive and we plan to find ways to continue our partnership with the Galiano Conservancy Association in the years ahead.

I was pleased to plan and co-facilitate an Initial Facilitator training weekend in Victoria August 2012 with Bella Cenezero from the Burnaby office as it allowed us to learn from each other.

In early December 2012 the Nanaimo GRG group met for a potluck dinner and the turnout was excellent. 29 GRG family members attended and 4 volunteers assisted. In early January 2013 the facilitators from the GRG Duncan Circle coordinated with the local bowling alley and Boston Pizza to offer an afternoon activity for 15 members of GRG families.

The only Parent Support Circle in my region is in Parksville which I also volunteer to cofacilitate. The group has struggled with low attendance and the referrals are low. The parents that do attend this circle say that they value the group. The referrals that once came our way from the Ministry of Children and Family Development, Public health and local schools have long dried up, in favour of the Triple P program. We continue to promote the PSC program as one that compliments the parent education programs.

As the 2012-2013 year drew to a close I was planning another regional workshop for facilitators in Parksville which took place on April 24th.

Plans for the coming 2013-2014 year continue to include; volunteer retention, program promotion and coordinating summer events for GRG families.

Circles

- GRGSC and PSC running in the Gordon Head and James Bay locations ceased effective May, 2012.
- The Mandarin PSC and GRGSC agreement was finalized with VIRCS in May 2012 and began on June 1. The pilot Circle completed at the end of July 2012 and was very successful with an average of 15 participants attending weekly. 35 parents and children attended the final celebration. Discussion for continuing this Circle is in progress as well as one for Japanese parents.

New Circles/Programs

- PSC and GRGSC running effective October 2012 Wednesdays at the main office. Dropin service Monday's effective June 2012.

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren

- A luncheon to celebrate the GRG Support Line was held on June 26, 2012. The event was well-attended by grandparents, staff from MCFD and the BC Representative for Children and Youth and PSS Executive Director.
- A 2-day, 1-night field trip to Galiano Island for GRG families, took place July 18-19, 2012. One Staff member from mid-Island and one staff member from Victoria planned

and attended the event. A second 1-day trip to Galiano for Victoria families took place mid-August.

- The Annual GRG Picnic took place August 25 at Playfair Park. There were 3 new GRG's in attendance who have been added to our distribution list. There were 22 GRG family members who attended.

GRG Support Line Christina Campbell and Dennis Nkojo

The Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Support Line completed its first full year of operation in February 2013. The support line office shifted to a new and much improved space across the hall from the head office in July 2012. Advocate, Roxanna Aune-Jacobsen left her position in October of 2012 and PSS welcomed Dennis Nkojo to the advocacy team.

Between April 1st 2012 and March 31st 2013, the GRG Support Line received a total of 167 calls; 153 from kinship caregiver, the majority living within the Coast Fraser region.

In addition to handling new and complex ongoing case work, key focus areas included improving our data collection tool to accurately capture and record the critical statistical information gathered through our calls with kinship families; planning and preparing for the upcoming GRG Legal Seminars as well as contributing to the revision work of the new GRG Legal Guide. Our work benefitted greatly from our collaboration with staff from the Office of the Representative for Children and Youth and from our regular consultations with policy analysts, directors and other staff within MCFD. Our weekly consults with our MCFD liaison staff were particularly productive and beneficial, not only to us, but directly for the families involved.

Systemic advocacy focused on drafting a PSS position statement on the return of kinship care benefits and meeting with our Member of Parliament on the impact of the Canada Pension Plan disability and children's benefit on grandparent-lead families. The excellent working relationship developed with key MCFD staff allowed for creative problem solving and the capacity to influence general policy and practice in a practical and progressive manner

The GRG Coordination Program in the Lower Mainland was established in July 2012 with funding from the Vancouver Foundation and additional funding support through our Gaming contract.
