MINUTES OF the September 11, 2010 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 12:55 pm by President Cheryl MacDonald. She thanked everyone for coming and for contributing to the Society.

2. Adoption of Minutes of the Annual General Meeting Held October 3, 2009

Moved by Rob Kaufman, to adopt the 2009 PSS AGM minutes; seconded by Sandi Halvorson; passed unanimously.

3. President's Report

The President reported that the Society had come through a year of uncertainty, particularly due to changes in funding availability. Ms. MacDonald stressed that PSS has a strong foundation and that the past year saw positive growth in provincial recognition. She commended Executive Director Carol Ross for her hard work and expressed the wish that PSS could secure improved staffing levels so that the Executive Director was freed to better utilize her skills and expertise.

Ms. MacDonald welcomed new board members Ali Ajdari and Mika Fryling. She explained that PSS needed to find new ways to market and promote itself, and to secure diversified funding. She encouraged everyone to thank the volunteers with whom they came in contact. "Without their assistance the Society would not be in existence".

4. Treasurer's Report and Approval of Audited Statements

Treasurer Rob Kaufman reported that the financial outlook was quite similar to that of the previous year, and acknowledged that PSS had not been as successful with the receipt of project grants this year. He noted the importance of having a financial cushion and that the Society's cushion was currently adequate. He anticipated that the financial outlook for the coming year would look similar, though likely with slightly less revenue.

MOTION: To accept and approve the audited financial statements as distributed. **MOVED:** By Rob Kaufman, seconded by Ali Ajdari; passed unanimously.

5. Appointment of Auditor

MOTION: To appoint Calvin Tompkins from Tompkins, Wozny, Miller & Company as auditor for the 2010 -2011 fiscal year. **MOVED:** By Rob Kaufman, seconded by Cheryl MacDonald; passed unanimously.

6. Executive Director's Report

Executive Director Carol Ross reported that the last year and a half had proven to be a particularly difficult time in which to secure grant funding. She advised that many other organizations had experienced the same difficulty. She expressed hope that the outlook would be more positive moving forward.

Ms. Ross noted that it had been a difficult year for PSS' Prince George location in particular, largely due to staffing changes. She said that PSS needed to continue to work and connect with fellow social service providers, advocates, politicians and government officials. She expressed appreciation for the positive work done with Minister and staff of the Ministry for Children and Family Development. Ms. Ross concluded by thanking PSS staff and volunteers. Written report submitted.

7. Program Reports

Written reports were submitted for all regions.

Sandi Halvorson, Program Coordinator for Central and North Island reported on her work with parenting circles, and grandparents raising grandchildren. She spoke of 2 new projects for the new fiscal year thanks to United Way funding and the Seniors Foundation in Duncan. She described a trend towards increased circle attendance when special topics and guest speakers were featured.

Debra Whitman, Program Coordinator for Victoria Region, reported on the successful move of the Victoria office; the positive impact of small projects for Grandparents Raising Grandchildren and negative impact of the loss of traditional United Way funding. She described creative activities to reach out to underserved communities and families.

Dahne Harding, Program Coordinator for Prince George Region reported on the work carried out to increase volunteer participation and circles for her region. She described the unique challenges faced by PSS in Prince George due to the number and diversity of parenting programs available and the struggling economy. She suggested that PSS could continue to play a valuable role in circle and parenting resource referrals.

Bella Cenezero, Program Director for the Lower Mainland, Fraser Valley, Coastal and Interior regions reported that the economic crisis had actually served to strengthen the collaboration between different partner organizations. She explained how the end of funding for the Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Coordinator project resulted in additional work for her position. She said that the involvement of practicum and summer students continued to be helpful. She also reported on new circles in her region and the revision of the circle program evaluation tool.

Discussion followed on possible directions for the Society in the coming year and the value of building on our unique skills and knowledge. Priorities included: a focus on Grandparents Raising Grandchildren; child welfare and family advocacy; education on internet safety for children. It was suggested that having an in-house advocate and educator would be ideal.

It also was suggested that the Society strike a Marketing/Promotion Committee to help to raise the profile of PSS and expand funding potential. There also was agreement to form a Training/Education Committee

8. Nominating Committee Report and Election of Directors

Executive Director's Report

For the fiscal year April 1 2010 to March 31, 2011 Respectfully submitted by Carol Ross

OVERVIEW OF THE YEAR

The past fiscal year was busy as we focused on updating our policies, training materials and resources on top of the fulltime commitment to creating and maintaining parenting services in the continuing climate of fiscal restraint. It was a year of searching for funding and creative solutions in each of our regions to do the work where great and growing need was identified. I continue to be amazed and humbled by all that is accomplished by our small cohort of paid staff and our huge cohort (thank goodness) of unpaid workers: our volunteers.

The themes for the year could be about financial maintenance, heavy workloads and heightened visibility. There were some funding crises especially when we were informed we would no longer receive our long term core funding from the United Way of Victoria, then again when our traditional Gaming funds were cut by 50% (later restored). Thanks to our hard working and dedicated paid and unpaid staff, we can be proud of what was accomplished in difficult times.

We began the work of exploring Facebook and a new website and produced a new rack card (with thanks to Cindy L'Hirondelle). We watched visits to the website grow as did calls for support, information and referral. The bright, colourful rack card proved to be an excellent tool in boosting visibility.

PROGRAM and ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

- We saw Co-ordinator changes in both Prince George and Victoria saying farewell to Dahne Harding and Deb Whitman and welcome to Jessica Turner and Nadia Sangster (this fiscal year).
- We hired 2 summer students and hosted 4 student practicum placements
- We were pleased to present the **Bill McFarland Award** to long time social worker, child protection and women's advocate Marsha Early from the West Kootenay region.
- We again coordinated a visit to the Legislature for a group of grandparents raising grandchildren (GRG).
- We hosted successful grandparents raising grandchildren picnics in 3 regions and received confirmation of federal funding to host a conference (Grand Gathering) for GRG in the Spring of 2011.
- We organized meetings and communication between GRG representatives and policy staff of MCFD that led to increased awareness by government of the inequities and struggles faced by grandparent led families.

- We completed an exciting 3 year research project into Child Protection Advocacy funded by the United Way of the Lower Mainland that culminated in a Deliberative Forum on Child Protection Advocacy Best Practice (with funding from the Office of The Representative for Children and Youth). It brought together wide representation by parents, grandparents, advocates, social workers, lawyers, policy makers and academics. The work to finalize and promote a Best Practice model continues.
- We completed 14 very popular GRG Legal Seminars and presentation in various locations across the Province.
- During the year there was a total of 35 Support Circles across the province delivered in six different languages (Cantonese, Mandarin, Spanish, Tagalog, Farsi and English), facilitated by 65 volunteers supported by volunteer child minders and Steering Committee members
- We held Initial Volunteer Facilitator Training sessions in Vancouver, Victoria, Duncan and Prince George and trained a total of 47 participants. 15 volunteers attended additional training in the Lower Mainland
- We produced and distributed 3 provincial newsletters; 22 Grandparent newsletters on Vancouver Island and monthly editions of The Village (Parenting Resource and Service Directory) for the Prince George region.
- Kaycee Jane, author of Frog or Prince: The Smart Girls Guide to Boyfriends, donated her time and expertise for 2 lively public presentations based on her research.
- We widely disseminated copies of the popular Grandparents Raising Grandchildren: A Legal Guide and distributed hundreds of the companion legal resource pamphlet.

RECOGNITION AND APPRECIATION

Parent Support Services Society is 37 years old and continues to thrive due to the participation and commitment of our staff, volunteers, funders, donors and the extensive network of community partners. Parents and grandparents tell us clearly and constantly how important our work is in supporting them and their families.

Our core staff is equivalent to 6 full time positions for the entire province. We could not possibly accomplish what we do without the skilled and extensive contributions of our volunteers. You will see the majority listed in our report and we know that behind the scenes there are many others who contribute yet remain humbly invisible. Our volunteers facilitate groups, sit on the Board of Directors and Steering Committees, advise us on projects and provide child care. They provide administrative support, consultation, translation, promotion, tech support, research, editing, layout, design and so much more. They scrounge for donations and shop for our picnics and Circles, find free meeting space and publicity. Well over 9000 volunteer hours were recorded again this year and we know thousands more hours have not been tracked.

We could not exist without our funders, donors and community partners. We want to recognize the continued support of the Ministry for Children and Family Development, the BC Gaming Policy Branch and the United Ways of Fraser Valley, Lower Mainland, and Prince George for funding our core programs. Our continued success also relies on the generosity of sister organizations that host our Support Circles and training sessions across the province, our faithful individual and corporate donors and our society members.

CONCLUSION

Poverty remains a key obstacle to family well being in BC as is the limited access to essential preventative services and resources. We hear from parents and grandparents regularly about their struggles with the court system, finding medical and other services, with inequities and injustice, finding safe affordable child care; securing respite and counselling and in resolving family problems. We are proud of the role we play in building skills and resiliency in families, communities and the social service sector. We know our peer based support group model works well and we know families need so much more.

In the current year we are expanding our work in individual and systemic advocacy and concentrating on strengthening our capacity to support parents and grandparents across British Columbia.

Thank you to Board members who are leaving, staying or just beginning and thank you to the PSS team of Bella Cenezero, Sandi Halvorson, Jessica Turner, Nadia Sangster, Grace Chen, Viktor Panfilenok, Malcolm Read and Annie Lavack. It is an honour to work with each and every one of you.

Program Director Report for the Lower Mainland / Coastal / Fraser Valley and Interior Regions For the fiscal year April 1 2010 to March 31, 2011

Over the past year, our dedicated facilitators, steering committees, volunteers, partner agencies have worked with me to sustain existing programs and develop new service initiatives.

HIGHLIGHTS

Two new Circles for Mandarin and English speaking parents were developed in Burnaby and Vancouver with the support of two new partner organizations CCM Centre and Killarney Park MB Church.

A *Grand Gathering* for grandparents raising grandchildren (GRGs) was planned with the support of representatives from 411 Senior Services Centre, Boys and Girls Club of Delta /Richmond, BC Council for Families and Langley Child Development Centre plus the help of many volunteers. The conference was held in May 2011 and had over 65 participants.

14 workshops were delivered in the Filipino, Spanish and Chinese communities and for the volunteers of ISS and SUCCESS to respond to the priority needs of immigrant serving organizations and Circle members for parent education.

Coordinated a Legal Seminar for GRGs in collaboration with Abbotsford Community Services. The seminar provided opportunity for GRGs to learn about their legal rights and responsibilities in raising grandchildren 24/7.

Three trainings were provided to Circle facilitators, steering committees and staff members of other organizations. These trainings prepare new facilitators in starting a Circle, enhance the work of long-term volunteers in running their Circles, and develop collaborations with community agencies.

Conducted numerous community consultation meetings; delivered parenting and life skills workshops; participated in community fairs; and delivered presentations to colleges, civic groups and community agencies wanting to start a Circle or learn more about PSS. Connected with colleges to explore practicum placements and potential for volunteer recruitment. Participated in three interagency committees in Vancouver, Tri-Cities and Burnaby on issues and initiatives relevant to children, youth and families.

In closing, I would like to acknowledge and thank all the volunteers, community partners, funders and donors for your invaluable contributions to continue the work that we do in supporting families in the Lower Mainland, Coastal, Fraser Valley and Interior regions.

I also would like to honour Aprille Everett who passed away in February of this year. Aprille was our dedicated volunteer for over 17 years as a caring and resourceful facilitator of Richmond Day Parent Support Circle. She had touched so many people's lives and will be sorely missed by all of us.

Central Vancouver Island Program Coordinator Report

For the fiscal year April 1 2010 to March 31, 2011 Submitted by Sandi Halvorson

The 2010-2011 was an extremely busy year here on Central Vancouver Island. Effort was invested in support the existing support circles; the Parent Support Circle in Parksville and the GRG Circles in Port Alberni and Duncan and then newly formed GRG circle in Nanaimo. A GRG circle was also started in Parksville later in 2011. The GRG groups in particular enjoyed a variety of guest speakers from local agencies as well as a few workshops. Some of the topics included; understanding and coping with ADHD, talking with kids about their sexuality, how to encourage children, setting healthy boundaries and insights in addiction issues. Each of the 4 GRG circles has a short newsletter that participants receive 9 to 10 times a year.

In May 2010 I had the opportunity of join grandparents from Vancouver Island and the lower mainland along with other PSS to visit the legislature to hear about the newly implemented Extend Family Program.

As our work with grandparents raising grandchildren continues one of the things that comes up time again is how appreciated opportunities to interact as families are; during this fiscal year the Port Alberni GRG Circle held its 5th annual picnic in June, the Duncan GRG circle held its first picnic in July and the Nanaimo GRG circle held a potluck supper in August.

A highlight for me each year is to have the opportunity to co-facilitate the Initial Training weekends for new volunteers, there were two initial trainings; the first in Victoria April and the second in Duncan in November.

Looking ahead to the 2011-12 fiscal year, I am looking forward to increasing the volunteer participation in my region. I am also looking forward to continuing to build on some of the family activities, such as the picnics and hope to encourage the GRG groups to interact with each other in some of these events. I am looking forward to planning a regional workshop on Vancouver Island for our volunteers and the opportunity to work with our new program coordinator in the Victoria office.

Victoria Program Coordinator Report For the fiscal year April 1 2010 to March 31, 2011 Submitted by Nadia Sangster

[NOTE: All the activities described in this report took place while Debra Whitman was still the Victoria Program Coordinator. Debra's last day with PSS was March 31, 2011.]

Parent Support Circles

- **Gordon Head Support Circle.** During the school year, met once per week with 2 facilitators. Group met occasionally over the summer in a park or a coffee shop, but not on a regular schedule. In September, weekly meeting schedule resumed.
- **Single Parents Support Circle.** Met bi-weekly at the PSS Victoria office, with child minding on site. .
- **Multicultural Support Circle.** Met every Thursday from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m. at George Jay Elementary School; PSS paid for on-site child minder. Have discussed moving location to Victoria Immigrant and Refugee Centre Society (VIRCS); 2 new volunteers from that agency have been trained.
- **Military Family Support Circle**. Met weekly on Monday mornings at Esquimalt United Church, with on-site child minding. Decision made to expand group to include non-military families in Esquimalt, as community is very integrated with the naval base and there was general difficulty attracting members from military families alone. has not resumed due to continued difficulty attracting members.

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren (GRG) Support Circles

- Salt Spring Island GRG Circle. Has 2 facilitators available on call.
- Victoria GRG Circle. Meets bi-weekly at the Victoria office, with 3 facilitators and on-site child minding.

GRG Special Events & Programs

- May 17: Visit to the Victoria Legislature. GRGs had lunch with the Minister for Children and Family Development and other Liberal MLAs; were introduced to the sitting house before Question Period, met with NDP representatives and met with the Liberal MLA for Courtney/Comox.
- June 15, 16: Legal Seminars. The first Seminar was held in Langford in the evening, and was attended by 5 grandchildren and 12 grandparents. The second Seminar was held in Victoria during the day and was attended by 2 grandchildren and 24 adults. The workshops were delivered by Executive Director Carol Ross and lawyer Forrest Nelson

- Aug 12: GRG Summer Picnic. Held at Beacon Hill Park, with 13 grandparents, and 17 grandchildren attending.
- Aug 25: Daytrip to Galiano Island. Planned in collaboration with the Galiano Island Conservancy. An educational program was run by Conservancy staff for 22 participants.
- Sept 20: Good Grief Workshop: Living and Learning through Grief and Loss.
- Oct 18: Financial Advice and Wills Workshop. Very successful, with a lawyer and a financial consultant donating their time and expertise.
- Jan 30: The Grinch Party. 20 people arrived to enjoy presents, crafts, music, lots of food, and entertainment. Volunteers helped plan the event.

Funding

- **Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Reducing the Isolation.** A grant of \$1100 was received from the City of Victoria, for 2 two-hour events, a summer picnic, and a Christmas party. The events successfully carried out were:
 - o the Summer Picnic at Beacon Hill Park,
 - the Good Grief Workshop,
 - o the Financial Planning and Wills Workshop, and
 - the Grinch Christmas Party.
- Sara Spencer Foundation. A grant of \$1500 was received in January and was used to pay for five GRG events:
 - the Victoria Legislature visit (child minding; parking),
 - o an IMAX visit, and
 - the two Legal Seminars (child minding; snacks).
 - Aug 25 trip to Galiano Island.

• Applications pending at the end of the fiscal year:

- Service Canada—seeking funding for a summer student;
- Capital Regional District Arts Development Service—seeking a \$1000 grant for art therapy;
