

"Let's start the conversation on ACEs!"

As research over the past twenty years has shown us, experiencing childhood adversity increases the risk of mental, and physical, health challenges over a person's lifetime. This workshop will provide an opportunity to view the documentary "Resilience", which explains this correlation, and offers strategic solutions to build resilience to trauma. We will also explore, through round table discussion, opportunities we have within our families and communities to mitigate the effects of adverse childhood experiences, known as ACEs. This workshop will be of interest to grandparents raising grandchildren and other kinship care givers



Lynne Godfrey is a parent, grandmother, former foster parent, dog lover, and a strong advocate for child and youth mental health. Through her work as a project lead under the CYMHSU, communities have had many opportunities to view documentary screenings that provide education and awareness around the impact of trauma, adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) and resiliency. She is a strong believer in "starting the conversation" about mental health, because it makes a difference!
