### New annual affordability payment for families receiving financial assistance through the Child in the Home of a Relative (CIHR) program.

The new annual affordability payment is an optional supplement of up to \$8,797.36 (youth aged 14 to 17 years) and \$8177.92 (youth aged 18 years) and is offered until the youth's 19th birthday.

This is an opt-in payment program – you must apply to receive the funds. It is an annual payment (not monthly). Payment will be paid in the month of the child's birthday.

• If that birthday occurred between April 2023 and June 2023 (when the supplement started), a prorated amount will still be paid out the month after the family applies, even if the youth turned 19.

This affordability payment is not taxable but must be reported on tax returns (you will be issued a T5). Therefore, this payment may impact eligibility for other benefits such as GST credits, Canada Child Benefit, or Fair Pharmacare. For more information, click the links below.

# The Provincial Tuition Waiver Program (PTWP) will be available for former youth in care of ANY age.

**Effective August 1, 2023** eligibility for the Provincial Tuition Waiver Program will open up to include include former youth in care, including kinship care, of any age, on any care status when they turned 19 regardless of their time in care.

In addition, a new annual grant will be available - up to **\$3,500** to help students who are recipients of the provincial tuition waiver pay for additional costs such as books, computers, and internet services.
